- This proposal is yet another example of spot-zoning and will set a precedent for the entire Taylor Way corridor. It should not be considered until a Local Area Plan has been completed. To do otherwise overrides a critical aspect of local community input as to the types of development residents want (or don't want) in their neighbourhood.
- I want a degree of predictability with zoning and development, yet this is another case of spot-zoning. **I strongly object to spot-zoning.** I despair that we are allowing developers to shape our community instead of residents. There is no point in having an Official Community Plan or Local Area Plans if Council continues to allow such significant exceptions.
- There are currently 230 publicly funded long-term care beds at this location. This proposal provides NO increase in public care beds. **We need more publicly funded long-term care beds, not expensive, private-care facilities.** The benefits to the community do not outweigh the

drawbacks. If a significant increase in density is requested there needs to be a significant increase in publicly funded long-term care capacity.

Dear Mayor, Councillors, Heather Keith, Jim Bailey, David Hawkins, Lisa Berg,

This letter is intended to reach those at the District of West Vancouver (my home town), who are relevant to decisions currently being made in the on-going cultivation of coach house policy, bylaws, building guidelines and codes.

A [REDACTED] s. 22(1) to the subject property where a coach house is proposed to be built, at 2950 Rosebery Avenue. [REDACTED] s. 22(1) has discussed with me [REDACTED] s. 22(1) concern, which is shared by neighbours of adjoining properties and those beyond, and which one is below:

The property owners at 2950 Rosebery Avenue have lost what they refer to as the original coach house, during a wind storm 2 years ago in January. A tree fell on that coach house, thereby destroying it.

There is a proposal for a new, soundly constructed replacement coach house, but not in the original, proximate to the street location, which is to the front and side of the large lot and home on Rosebery Avenue.

It would appear from the proposed plans online

@ [westvancouver.ca/developmentapplications](http://westvancouver.ca/developmentapplications) that the District is considering the coach house location to be behind the main house, at the bottom southwest corner of the lot. Because questions to Lisa Berg remain unanswered, neighbours who are concerned about this change of location have interpreted that, seemingly, a stream-lined approach has been created by the District for coach house development on existing, single-family-dwelling lots - to follow guidelines with a standard, across-the-board approach. That is to say - coach houses are to the rear of a property - à la 'laneway house'.

The concern expressed by those who live in this immediate neighbourhood is the unavoidable degradation and intrusion upon the natural treed environment which will follow, added onto by way of driveway and

utilities extension. Already 40 or more trees from this grove have been removed as a result of the adjoining property sub-division!

Additionally, the natural hydrology of these downwardly sloped neighbouring yards, benefitted by this remaining, thereby increasingly significant section of urban forest, has been damaged by way of a drainage ditch being in-filled and a wall being built. (Was that permit-ted?) This area also provides a long-standing coyote run.

The remaining mature trees along the southwest fence line will most certainly be in jeopardy, with tree roots damaged and many important branches cut away. Although these trees have years ago been topped, they do still provide significant ecological services as well as privacy.

It is felt to be an error of judgement for the trees to be culled by the District. There would be no reason for this environmental loss if the coach house was kept in its original, well-suited location, in front of the main house, close to utilities and ease of automobile parking.

And so the question remains unanswered, what value is the District applying to large, fully functioning trees in an established neighbourhood, directly below large, clearcut developments and the above-highway development of BPP Area 5 & 6. The salvation is not a 5' diameter stormwater pipe but an intact functioning and honoured treed environment.

We have just lost again, big-time, at s. 22(1). Enough! There is no justifiable basis for continued, unnecessary tree felling.

I respectfully put to Mayor, Council and staff that You cannot put off protecting the urban forest of Altamont any longer by hanging either your individual or your collective hat on waiting for an 'Urban Forest Management Plan'.



To Mayor Booth and all Council Members of The District of West Vancouver:

Further to my previous and on-going communications about the unfair treatment being directed at [REDACTED] s. 22(1) please note the following.

If the District could truly admit to ignorance of the problem then that would be a place to start. Unfortunately, the reality is that every level of the District that I have spoken with is fully aware of the extent of the problem, professes that their hands are tied and chooses to do nothing more about it other than treating [REDACTED] s. 22(1) as a nuisance. All non-compliant condo owners have learned that it pays to circumvent the system because no one will ever follow up. This not acceptable.

There has never been a question that [REDACTED] s. 22(1) contractor failed to close a permit for work she was authorized by the District of West Vancouver to do. Her contractor then subsequently executed work he was not authorized to do. We do not dispute this and find ourselves forced to remediate the non-compliant work and your internal research confirms our slow the progress has been toward getting the documentation in place for us to proceed. The fact that it has taken 10 years from the last time a building inspector set foot in [REDACTED] s. 22(1) illustrates how profoundly broken the permit system is. Please note we have been following the correct processes to get the appropriate permits in place for the remedial work and these approvals have now been issued. That does not mean [REDACTED] s. 22(1) problem is solved and she will now just go away.

The ultimate problem is the willful blind eye turned to all illegally performed work of a similar nature in condos where no permit was applied for in the first place. These units are not hard to find. I found a few just by looking at real estate listings on line and was then advised by a District employee "we aren't paid to look at real estate listings". In the same conversation, I was advised that if I forwarded these listings the District would then treat them as a complaint and proceed to investigate. I've even come across a unit where a permit was issued for major renovation work between the kitchen and Dining Room and the inspector of record ignored the missing weather walls IN THE SAME ROOM and closed the permit with no further action required. In [REDACTED] s. 22(1) case there has been no blind eye turned. I have never asked there to be one and have only ever asked for fair and equitable treatment.

**IT IS NOT MY JOB TO DO YOUR POLICING!!! IT IS YOURS!!!!!!** If need be I will forward exterior photographs of assorted buildings throughout the District that clearly suggest units where balconies have been enclosed and may well be non-compliant with regards to permits and possible weather wall removal. If I do so, this will have to be treated as a complaint and each and every unit will need to be inspected for compliance.

I've also become aware of at least 4 grandfathering agreements between DWV and strata councils of larger condo buildings, addressing similar related issues. None of these agreements has resulted in the need to replace any weather walls as part of the remedy. The fact that these buildings have larger numbers of suites to spread the legal costs over further demonstrates how unfair the process is for the smaller buildings and, ultimately, individual condo owners like [REDACTED] s. 22(1). Again, this information has not been hard to find and, once again, confirms the level of understanding that [REDACTED] s. 22(1) exists at all levels of governance and DWV operations about the problem.

A simple letter to all strata councils in the District to advise of the non-compliance problem and the intent to resolve it in a timely fashion will get the ball rolling. Remediation, such as that being required of s. 22(1) can then begin across the District, thereby levelling the playing field for her. To have her pay for remediation and then find that DWC grandfathers existing conditions at a later date is what leads to billing the District for the unfair treatment and costs incurred by s. 22(1)

The fact that this whole issue has once again been punted from the political level back to the bureaucratic/administrative level with zero acknowledgment of the larger issue continues to reinforce the inequity of the existing circumstances within the DWV. The District's unwillingness or inability (or both) to tackle the larger issue is the root of the problem in the first place, and hence, the source of our frustration and communication with you as the Mayor and Council of West Vancouver.

I look forward to your reply with suggestions of next steps to resolve the problem across the District.

West Vancouver Mayor and Council

As [Redacted] s. 22(1) I am pleased to see the final readings supporting the revised Tree Bylaw were executed at the October 20 Council Meeting, and that the vote for the new Bylaw is on the agenda for November 2.

I am happy that Council and Staff determined that additional tree protection is not required for most tree species, and am also happy with the additional protections for specific species and bird-related trees. The results of the 2013 and 2018 LIDAR studies were very promising, showing both excellent canopy coverage combined with an increasing canopy in most neighbourhoods. Resident survey results showed that most respondents are happy with the current level of tree canopy. Residents don't often notice the 5 to 10% annual growth of trees: but the falling of even one tree can be emotional. I believe that the new Bylaw strikes a good balance between tree protection, and allowing residents to take care of their own trees.

One minor suggestion for a future modification is regarding Schedule B – Replacement Tree Species. A range of excellent varieties are including in the four-page schedule, but there are three trees that I strongly suggest should be removed:

1. Redwood
2. Giant Sequoia
3. Sitka Spruce

The first two trees are not native to B.C., and are among the world's largest trees, growing up to 4 feet in height per year after only 3 years, and requiring large amounts of water! These are not trees suitable for a residential area. Similarly, the Sitka Spruce is the largest tree native to Canada, and while a beautiful tree, will cause issues if planted in a residential neighbourhood.

Finally, I did see a motion from the September 20 Council meeting "THAT staff be directed to develop guidelines for the maintenance of hedges on private property". As hedges are not included in the proposed Tree Bylaw, I am hoping this subject does not get lost. It was evident during the Working Group's interaction with residents that unkempt hedges created unnecessary stress and contention in many instances.

Congratulations on promoting a bylaw that does not add unnecessary bureaucracy and expense for West Vancouver!

Every Canadian deserves a safe and affordable place to call home. This has been a central priority of our Government since taking office in 2015, and it is a commitment that we reaffirmed in the 2020 Speech from the Throne.

Last week, the Minister of Families, Children and Social Development, the Honourable Ahmed Hussen, announced the launch of the first round of the **Housing Supply Challenge**, to help foster new housing supply solutions across the country.

The first round, called *Data Driven*, seeks solutions to address gaps in housing data which are often outdated, inconsistent and not openly available, making it more difficult to manage housing supply issues. Participants will create technology or methodology-based solutions to improve data collection, sharing, analysis and integration, thus improving decision-making on housing supply. This first round will disburse up to \$25 million to fund a variety of new solutions.

The Housing Supply Challenge will be delivered by Canada Housing and Mortgage Corporation (CMHC). The Data Driven round will be open for applications until January 20, 2021.

Up to 25 Stage 1 applicants will be shortlisted and given \$100,000 in funding to support the development of their final submissions. Then, \$22.5 million will be shared among multiple solutions.

Last month, our Government announced the new **Rapid Housing Initiative (RHI)** to help address urgent housing needs of vulnerable Canadians by rapidly creating new affordable housing and helping support Canada's economic recovery by creating employment in the housing and construction sectors.

The RHI is the newest initiative of the National Housing Strategy (NHS) and was created to meet the needs of the COVID-19 pandemic, with the goal of rapidly creating up to 3,000 permanent new units of affordable housing across Canada. The RHI is available to municipalities, provinces, territories, Indigenous governing bodies and organizations, and non-profit organizations.

Today, I would like to relay further details of the RHI. This \$1B investment is divided into two equal funding streams:

- **Major Cities Stream:**
  - The RHI provides immediate support to a list of predetermined Municipalities that have been identified based on highest levels of renters in severe housing need and people experiencing homelessness.
- **Projects Stream:**
  - An applications-based process via web portal will be open from October 26 to December 31, 2020 to Provinces, Territories, Municipalities, Indigenous governing bodies and organizations, and non-profit organizations.
