Before you start the survey, let's review some facts

What is the current state of District arts and culture facilities?

- Three of the District's dedicated arts facilities (Art Museum, Music Box, and Silk Purse), originally built as single-family cottages, are in poor condition and are at the end of life.
- West Vancouver's arts and culture community is in need of adequate space to continue carrying out their activities, which include painting and art making classes, small performance spaces, theatre classes, gallery/exhibition spaces, etc.

What research has been done to identify the need for a replacement arts and culture facility?

- The District's Arts & Culture Facilities Plan, developed in 2019, identified the need for 21,000 sq. ft. of space to continue providing art programs for all ages. The amount of space identified is to accommodate exhibitions, small group rehearsals and performances, administration areas for arts groups, and multipurpose spaces for a variety of community uses.

What are the goals of this community engagement and this survey?

- To confirm and build on the vision for the future arts and culture facility. A replacement arts and culture facility will complement what already exists on the North Shore.
