Although I live in a Baptist Housing facility in another municipality, I want to share my experience as someone who is benefitting from the type of housing and support Baptist Housing provides.

As an octogenarian, moving into an affordable apartment [REDACTED] s. 22(1), I had no idea the amazing place in which I had just landed. From the very first day, I sensed a warm friendliness and general sense of wellbeing among the residents, almost all of whom expressed deep gratitude for living here.

I am impressed by the regular attention given to maintenance of appliances, building, and grounds. Our facility has a large common room where the administration offers or facilitates events that gather us together over coffee, board games, movie and sports watching, potlucks, joyful celebrations of birthdays and annual holidays. On special occasions they invite the nearby nursery and kindergarten schools to join us for heartwarming, intergenerational encounters. They regularly bring in professionals who keep us informed for our safety and health. The administration also encourages and applauds residents who want to volunteer our time and expertise (baking cookies, watering flower boxes, teaching art and exercise classes to mention only a few) which give us a greater sense of ownership and pride of place in our community. At quarterly residents meetings, we are informed of any upcoming changes and are given the opportunity to voice our concerns. The administration's priority of showing care and respect is contagious, creating a culture in which everyone matters and no one is forgotten. Neighbours gladly help each other from which strong friendships form. [REDACTED] s. 22(1) I have thrived in this place and have experienced the Baptist Housing Society as the most generous and benevolent landlord I could want.

From my observation the Baptist Housing Society values the health and wellbeing of its residents higher than turning a profit for investors. I suggest that in every municipality, the wellbeing of its seniors contributes to the health of the whole community. As seniors, our wellbeing is enhanced when we have housing options that allow us to remain independent, active and connected. As we age, we need facilities that offer appropriate support for our changing needs. I understand Inglewood Care Centre will offer all of these options. Therefore, I encourage you as Mayor and Councillors of one of British Columbia's finest cities to approve the Baptist Housing Society's proposed redevelopment. I believe it will contribute to the further enhancement and health of your whole city.

West Vancouver has stunning natural assets, but the Ambleside waterfront has historically underperformed as a social destination for residents. Batch changed that almost immediately.

I understand the operator is working closely with District staff to resolve outstanding issues, and I'm grateful for the work being done on both sides. But I'd encourage Council to treat this not just as a permitting matter, but as a community wellbeing priority. The number of residents asking when Batch will reopen speaks for itself.

Please support its return this summer, and consider what it would mean to make it a permanent part of what West Vancouver offers its residents every year.

Thanks for writing to Council, I can clarify the questions you've raised about the tenure of the proposed infill building and the existing rental tower:

Regarding the new 19-storey building:

In early concept discussions last year, the applicant included a rental commitment for 6 years. When the formal rezoning application was submitted this year, the applicant had revised the proposal to not include any rental commitment. The current application proposes a strata building from day one, with no secured rental component in the new apartment building.

Regarding the existing 20-storey rental building:

The existing building will be secured as rental through zoning, which means that if the owner ever redeveloped that portion of the site, the replacement building would also be required to be rental. This zoning tool is intended to protect the long-term rental use of the site, regardless of the age or condition of the current structure.

I hope this helps clarify the difference between the earlier concepts and the formal application now under review.
