Ambleside Revitalization Commission Bylaw No. 4674, 2011

District of West Vancouver

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A bylaw to establish the Ambleside Revitalization Commission

WHEREAS Section 143(1)(c) of the *Community Charter* provides that Council may establish and appoint a commission to manage property held by the municipality;

AND WHEREAS the District of West Vancouver (the "District") is the registered owner in fee simple of real property located in the District, including without limitation real property in the 1300 Block of Marine Drive, West Vancouver and real property commonly known as the Municipal Hall Precinct in West Vancouver as shown shaded in the maps in Schedule A to this Bylaw (collectively, the "Municipal Property");

AND WHEREAS Council considers it desirable to solicit advice and recommendations from a Commission in regard to the use, density, green and sustainability attributes, servicing, management, disposition, and stewardship of the Municipal Property,

NOW THEREFORE, Council for the District, in Open Meeting assembled, FNACTS AS FOLLOWS:

Part 1 Citation

1.1 This bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "Ambleside Revitalization Commission Bylaw No. 4674, 2011".

Part 2 Definitions

2.1 For the purposes of this Bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires,

"Member" means a voting member of the Commission.

Part 3 Establishment

3.1 Council establishes a commission to be known as the "Ambleside Revitalization Commission".

Part 4 Functions of Commission

- 4.1 The Commission will provide advice and recommendations to Council in regard to the use, density, green and sustainability attributes, servicing, management, disposition, and stewardship of the Municipal Property.
- 4.2 Council may designate additional real property owned by the District as Municipal Property subject to this Bylaw.

Part 5 Composition and Appointment

- 5.1 The Commission is comprised of seven (7) voting members as follows:
 - (a) five individuals appointed by Council;
 - (b) the Mayor; and
 - (c) a Councillor designated by Council.
- 5.2 The District's Chief Administrative Officer and Director of Finance will be non-voting members of the Commission.

Part 6 Term of Appointment

6.1 A Member, other than the Mayor and the Councillor referred to in section 5.1(c), serves for a term of three years, at the pleasure of Council. There is no limit on the term of the Mayor or the Councillor referred to in section 5.1(c).

Part 7 Chair and Commission Meetings

- 7.1 The Members will appoint a Chair other than the Mayor, to serve at the pleasure of the Commission.
- 7.2 The rules of procedure applicable to Council committees under Council Procedure Bylaw No. 4483, 2006 apply to the meetings and meeting procedures of the Commission.

Part 8 Remuneration

8.1 No Member of the Commission will receive any remuneration for services for being a Member of the Commission.

8.2 Despite section 8.1, the District will reimburse a Member for reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred on behalf of and previously approved by the Commission.


